What to do yani? If people would take a long hard look at the recent elections, it really all boiled down to the choice of 'Prinsipyo vs. Caldero' for majority of the electorate in Nabua. It's not a pretty description of what happened, but it spoke volumes about the candidates and the citizenry alike. Resorting to vote-buying only shows that the candidates themselves do not trust their own capacity and capabilities as aspiring public officials. Why do you have to pay the voters if you are able and capable enough of doing the job you are aspiring for? If you have enough qualification and experience, do you have to buy the votes of the people? Again, it speaks a lot about the candidate and his party, not only in terms of capability but also about intentions and purpose of one's candidacy. Does the end ever justify the means?

So who do we fault now, the buyer or the seller? If one would look at the current socio-economic condition in our town right now, just basing it on the number of people doing their marketing at the Camarin as against those shopping at the LCC, I can safely assume that majority of the people of Nabua belongs to the DE segment, a number in the BC segment and only a few belonging to the A (as in Affluent) class. Of course some people would protest this kind of analysis but then again, try comparing the prices of goods at the spic & span supermarket in the mall as against those in the "sisaran"! I guess it's a simplistic approach, or a rather nice way of saying, that most of Nabua's inhabitants are barely above the poverty threshold level (the poverty incidence is 33% on the national level. In Nabua, it would be safe to assume that poverty incidence could well be between 35 – 45%). Can you blame then the ordinary voter who had mouths to feed and a growling stomach to fill if he would exchange his vote for 3 pieces of silver?

I believe that most of the current politicians sitting in their comfy chairs in the municipio has long known about these but had not done anything to improve the lot of our fellow Nabuenos. The reason is fairly obvious, the extreme poverty of the people can be exploited come election time. Let the poor drown in poverty so that we can be their savior come election. And this is what happened during the last elections, even if the elections were already automated where dagdag bawas is said to be a thing of the past. The sad reality for an aspiring public official is that - and this is true not only in our beloved Nabua but in almost all other towns in the Rinconada area - sincere intentions and good platform of government will not make you win an election. Only money will . . . in your face the voter will shout: SHOW ME THE MONEY!!!!.

Can you blame the people then if that is what their "leaders" had turned them to be?

Unfortunately, that is the true and sad legacy of the Kapampangan Inc. and the Simbulan Dynasty that will long be remembered by Nabuenos.

Congratulations to all the newly installed public officials (both local & nationals) who took their oaths and will be starting their duties today as duly elected public officials regardless whether they cheated or not during the previous elections. The national elections may have been fraud free but it is no secret that the local elections were littered with vote buying (lucky for those who got the P1,000 plus a sack of rice!) The people - er, the money of the candidates - have spoken and let us recognize the mandate no matter how fraudulent the way they won the election. Again, congratulations particularly to Vice Mayor Fortuno (madaling rapoon pero masakit anapon - di maturakan ko mig meeting ko reunion! - ;))

It is our hope that all our new public officials would be true to their word of upholding the public good and serving the people. Whether or not they would keep the promises they made during the campaign, it is up to the people to remind them that public service is not serving themselves to the spoils of election victory but being servants of the people. They are public servants, not only of their supporters and their party, but most importantly of all the Nabuenos(whether they voted for them or not).

It is our hope that the new administration will do away with expensive and show-off projects that are not only a drain to taxpayer's money but also does not benefit those who are more in need. An example of this is the planned Integrated Transport Terminal whose construction would benefit only a select few (the bidding process may be transparent but the

bribe process is not - the money can be easily deposited in one's account or in the form of condominium units in flashy addresses in the metropolis). The reason the town is very congested (the main reason the proponents of this ITT) is not a lack of an integrated terminal where all the vehicles going to and from Nabua could all be located.

It is our hope that instead of big ticket projects like the planned Integrated Terminal, the local government would instead channel the limited funds to projects and programs that would be beneficial to their constituents especially the majority of the poor and needy of Nabua. One glaring example of this is the large number of padyak operators in Nabua. Almost all able-bodied men of the town are plying this laborious and back breaking trade. How can one be expected to generate a decent income when the almost 500 padyak drivers are vying for the same number of passengers, day in and day out.

The reason there is so much congestion in the town is not the lack of place where all transport vehicles can be parked but the sheer number of padyaks that clog the small streets of Nabua. Reducing the number of padyak is not the solution, but providing alternative livelihood to these padyak drivers would be a good start. In a town where padyak driving has become the main source of employment for a majority of our menfolk, it does not paint a good picture of the town. It is our hope that the local government would provide alternative sources of income for their constituents.

A decade or so before, Nabua had a number of products that were locally made like the buri hats and baskets, siggid from coconut fronds, and utensils and decorative materials from coconut husks. There are other countless products that can be produced locally, but there is a need for initiative and support from the local governments for livelihood projects to prosper in the town. The new leaders would need to tap the inherent creativity and industriousness of the Nabuenos for the town and its people to prosper.

There are a thousand and one livelihood projects that can be initiated in the town, from reviving the production of coconut by products (the siggid and the bunot sold in the sisaran now comes from either Albay or other far flung towns) to the establishment of a baranggay garden in each baranggay that would produce high yielding crops that can be sold in the public market as well as at the LCC supermarket instead of getting their supplies from other sources. Environment-friendly and reusable buri bags can be made by the womenfolk of Nabua and supplied to the LCC Supermarket to replace the non-biodegradable plastics that would one day clog its drainage and rivers that ultimately lead to the unending flooding in the town. The local government must be able to make arrangements with the LCC management that locally made products are available and used in the LCC mall. LCC should be made to realize that since they benefit from the population, it is also their responsibility to provide opportunities to the local community and its people.

These are just a few of the livelihood projects that can make the out of school youths and tambays productive and the town of Nabua to be prosperous. No matter how the previous leaders of the town trumpet that Nabua is now a first class municipality, it is a fact that the people are still mired in first class poverty.

I do believe that the local government has its own vision (that's a guess, I don't know if you can find a mission-vision statement in the munisipyo). But I want to believe the new local administration have one and hope that it is not a recycled one from her husband's ;). As we have seen in the more than 10 years of The Husband, the vision was only about treating the munisipyo as a business enterprise - a money-making machine for their own benefit. It was not about developing the town, its industries and uplifting the lives of the local population. For the town of Nabua to progress and its people to improve its lot, the local administration has to go back to basics. People first, not businesses. One thing you will notice in the LCC mall, majority of the tenants there are not from Nabua, they even have someone from Mindanao

selling mobile phones and accessories. And don't tell me that all those employed in the LCC are from Nabua, I could hear some of the staff speaking in Bikol (not Bikol-Naga but Bikol-Albay!). So much for claiming that the mall brings employment to the Nabuenos. Sure it does, but how many from the thousands who are unemployed but capable?

Again, for the second time, am stating the obvious. For the town of Nabua to progress and its people to improve its lot, the local administration has to go back to basics. The local government needs to develop the local industries for the town to be truly considered a first class municipality. But the hard part is that the town has no industry to speak of. As what ABNAU mentioned, there is no single specific local product that Nabua can truly speak of as its own. I've been to numerous places in the countryside and I could mention a few such as the famous Liliw's hand-made tsinelas, Luisiana, Laguna's bags made of pandan leaves, Lucban's pancit habhab and longganisang Lucban (yummy!).

Aside from such native delicacies, those towns i mentioned have their local tourist spots that enabled their native products to develop and prosper that ultimately has become synonymous with the town and its people. Unfortunately for Nabua, not only the town lacks a natural tourist draw, it doesn't have a native product it can call its own. This situation has been excarated by the seeming neglect of past administration to develop a native industry which Nabuenos can be truly proud of. In the last decade or so, past administrations, particularly the most previous one, made the easy way out of generating revenue - attracting outside capital instead of developing and supporting local entrepreneurs. That's the reason why the town doesn't have an OTOP entry, unlike the nearby town of Bato (pansit bato) and the other Rinconada towns.

I believe it is high time for the local government to focus on developing the local industries that would benefit the vast majority of Nabuenos instead of attracting outside investors to put their businesses on establishments that are paid for by the local taxpayers (don't tell me the planned integrated terminal would not be financed by a loan to be paid for by Nabuenos, they've done that with the Nabua Commercial Complex, they can do it again with the Nabua Integrated Terminal!) Goodness gracious, Nabua is a transit point only for local bus companies! There would not be that large number of vehicles that would be using that terminal unlike the transport terminals of Naga and Legaspi which are major take-off points for trips bound to Manila. The town would be better off having a protective dike constructed to protect it from floodwaters than having an integrated terminal whose main beneficiary would not be the people of Nabua (but the pockets of local officials ;)) Don't tell me i didn't tell you about this! :)

In any case, the Pintakasi should be a showcase of the town's products and people and not treated as a money-making venture for the benefit of the local government and its officials. What has been happening over the years is that the Pintakasi have become a showcase for the local officials to trump up their so called "achievements" to the well-heeled balikbayans in exchange for their hard earned dollars. There's nothing wrong with welcoming the native sons & daughters of Nabua back to the town, but what becomes exasperating is that the local population are the ones shortchanged ending up being excluded from the Pintakasi's major events - Grand Pintakasi Ball, Ms. Alingsangan, Ms Gay Beauty Pageant, etc. Does the majority of the Nabuenos get the chance to participate in these activities, much less be able to watch them if an entrance fee of not less than P300 is required? The sad thing about it is that the Pintakasi had become an elitist event where the majority of the hardworking Nabuenos - the ones who make possible the town of

Nabua to exist by paying their taxes - are relegated to the sidelines and reduced as mere spectators to all the events wherein they should be the ones being feted for making the Nabua that it is now and what it had been for centuries - a peaceful and laid back community one can always come home to wherever you had been in this world.

The money generated from the Pintakasi should be used for pro-poor programs instead of being used to fund other events/programs of the local government. To my knowledge, such events have their own funding coming from the annual municipal government budget. Sponsorships and other revenues generated from the Pintakasi can be better used as a way of promoting the native products of the town and funding training programs for those who are interested in producing and developing indigenous goods and products. For several years I have worked hand in hand with the local governments of some towns in both Laguna and Quezon to stage major events in their localities and I have seen first hand how those LGUs really put the interest of their people integrated into these events. I have been involved in the staging of some festivals in Laguna (Coconut Festival of San Pablo City, Calauan's Pinyahan and Liliw's Tsinelas Festival), Quezon (Tiaong's Lubid Lubid, Tayabas' Mayohan, Lucban's Pahiyas and Lucena's Pasayahan) and Marinduque (Moriones Festival & Gasan Gasan Festival) and the role of the LGUs have been mainly confined, aside from ensuring organization and order in the events, to ensuring that the local industries and entrepreneurs are represented in all the events, their products showcased alongside that of the more well known brands and establishments at the same time allowing the local businessmen the opportunity to earn additional revenues during the event.

I believe the local officials of Nabua could learn a thing or two from the LGUs of the said towns and cities not only in staging such large events but at the same time promoting local tourism and their indigenous goods. The difference perhaps as to why events such as those I have mentioned is a success is that the local population are the main beneficiaries of these events not only by making them part of the festivities but most importantly, involving them directly into the planning and staging of the activities. The LGUs of these towns and cities adhere to the principle of a government of the people, by the people and for the people. And that could be the main difference as to why the Pintakasi celebration in Nabua has been a small time affair since time immemorial, its theme and activities repeated over and over again, mostly rehashed year in and year out.

Regarding an open space where people can avoid "atake de corazon" I have a better idea which I think would be of interest to the local government. But I have to write the next time as Stage 6 of the TDF is about to start. Go Lance go! ;)

The project's estimated payback period per feasibility study is 10 years. I am doing the finishing touches to a project proposal that I would like to submit to the local government of Nabua and to the Honorable Congressman of CSur's Fifth District for consideration.

This proposal would have three underlying objectives that would address the current issues in the town. The main component of the project would involve the following:

1. Flood control & disaster mitigation
2. Tourism & recreation development
3. Energy & water management

All of the above would be realized thru a large swath of land cutting across the town that would connect two bodies of water designed to minimize the destructive effects of floodwaters at the same time address the lack thereof during the dry season.

It is an economic enterprise that has the potential to make Nabua a tourist draw utilizing one of the town's most potent enemy - floodwaters. If you can't defeat floodwater, the only option one have is to better make use of it, and use it to your utmost advantage. Using an integrated development plan, the main purpose of the project is designed to address the

following issues the town is currently facing: the constant threat of flooding, job scarcity and revenue & income generation.

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Seriously, the idea calls for the construction of a mile-long protective dike that would protect the town center from the rampaging waters coming from the BARIT river (the one running across barangays Sn Jose-Sn Miguel-Santiago) which whenever the said river overflows, the "Centro" is engulfed in neck deep floodwater in some areas. The main purpose is to protect the most vulnerable and densely populated area of the town, where the bulk of the town's business and industrial activity as well as some agricultural production, is concentrated.

The protective dike would be in the form of a flood control channel capable of storing large amounts of water that can be used for drinking, irrigation, energy generation as well as for recreational purposes. White water rafting, waterworld theme park? could be possible . . . but how about zip lining for three kilometers then dropping for a swim or going for a recreational fishing while riding a boat down the river? There are a lot of possibilities.

It would take a lot of planning, creativity and political will on the part of the local government but it is doable, three years would be long enough to make it happen. The hard part is where to get the money but if the political leaders of the town would use the IRA and their PDAF (a.k.a. pork barrel) for the betterment of their constituents and not to line their own pockets, everything is possible. So folks, better monitor the people you elected on how they would spend their IRA & CDF allocations. It's not their money, it is yours!

So young, so corrupt

ALONG the dusty streets of one barangay (village) in Pangasinan stand 24 shiny new streetlights. Inscribed on the poles are the words "Project of the Sangguniang Kabataan."

The erection of the streetlights cost the youth council P120,000. Twelve percent of the total cost was pocketed by Santino (not his real name), an SK chair, as "reward" from the supplier. Santino describes this as a "standard operation procedure" or "SOP" in the barangay.

"Of course the barangay chair knows this. In fact, we even split the money," Santino said.

He said the requested budget for the project would not have been released without the approval of the barangay chair who, incidentally, is his uncle.

The "SOP" is often exclusive to three major players: the supplier, the SK chair and the barangay chair.

However, not all SK chairs benefit from the deal. Sometimes, the SK chair becomes a mere spectator of the game. That is why, Dan (not his real name), SK chair from Rizal, prefers to handle his projects' billings alone.

In 2008, Dan was forced to honor a contract the barangay chair had fixed. "Our barangay chair made a deal with the supplier without my consent. Then the bill was charged to the SK budget," he said.

Dan said he was tempted by the 10-percent commission the supplier had promised but after the project was finished, Dan did not receive a single centavo.

"I was waiting for the money but none came," he said.

Dan's first and last encounter with the supplier started with a sports league the SK council organized in 2008.

Overpriced basketballs

Dan paid the supplier P8,750 for five scorebooks and two basketballs when these only cost P3,375.

The scorebook was originally priced at P75 each but it was raised to P150. The price of each basketball was P1,500 but this was jacked up to P4,000.

"We could have spent that money for another project," he said.

As SK officials enter the world of politics, they are introduced to practices that are unfamiliar to them in the beginning.

Exposure

In a study conducted by the University of the Philippines Center for Integrative and Development Studies (UP CIDS) in 2009, some SK respondents said they were exposed to or directly involved in questionable practices of corruption.

SK National Federation (SKNF) president Jane Cajés did not deny the allegations but asserted that adult politicians behind the SK should be put under scrutiny as well. “SK members are exploited, yes, but we need to discern if corruption is done only by the SK,” she said.

To solve this problem, the SKNF proposed the SK Reform Bill in 2009 to adjust the minimum age requirement from 15 years old to 18 years old. “When you’re too young, you’re too scared,” Cajés said.

Kabataan partylist Representative Raymond Palatino expressed the same views.

“If the SK is ineffective, it means we didn’t guide them correctly,” Palatino said.

Palatino recently filed House Bill No. 1963 or the proposed “SK Strengthening and Reform Act” which seeks to give fiscal autonomy to the organization and to empower the Katipunan ng Kabataan as the highest consultative body of the SK.

Independent actions

But not all SK members are driven to the dark side of politics. Some have managed to stand out using their own potentials without the intervention of adults.

Humerlito Dolor, vice governor of Oriental Mindoro, is one example. He started his career in the SK.

But unlike most politicians, he is not a member of a political clan. In fact, he was the first in the family to run for public office.

At age 16, Dolor was serving as the provincial SK president. Despite his hectic schedule as leader of the youth council, he was a consistent dean’s lister and even graduated cum laude at the Divine World College of Calapan. At 29, he finished his doctorate in Philosophy.

“Mastering what you have to do will help in balancing your job and your studies,” he said.

Dolor wasn’t just any other SK member – he authored the 1997 SK Constitution and by-laws. He also passed a resolution which brought the first computers in several public schools to Oriental Mindoro.

A former SK national treasurer, Dolor also passed a resolution prohibiting local and foreign miners from extracting nickel in the town of Naujan.

Dolor’s political experience is one proof that the SK could be a very good venue for community service and development.

Potential leaders

Despite the barrage of issues about SK incompetence and deregulation, the Kabataan party-list group and the SKNF firmly believe in its potential. Calls for its abolition have been thwarted by these youth leaders.

“We have more than 300,000 volunteers through the SK system. The government wants to eliminate this unique institution which encourages youth participation and volunteerism in community affairs,” Palatino said.

The UP CIDS study also found that youth participation in local governance promotes holistic development among the youth. Being a member of the youth council taught them the value of time management, responsibility, teamwork and sense of nationalism.

The study also showed that SK federations from all levels were consistent in holding the annual Linggo ng Kabataan in which youth leaders showcase their proposals for the promulgation of relevant ordinances.

Some federations have passed ordinances on smoking ban and curfew for minors, provisions against chemical waste dumping and creation of sports facilities for the youth.

Tomorrow (Monday), thousands of potential youth leaders will be elected SK chairs in their respective barangay. They will be the next generation of leaders in the country.

But who among them can survive the jungle?

For Cajes, only the young leaders can answer the question. "The SK is the voice of the youth. Let's vote for the leader we envision ourselves to be," she said. Hon Sophia Balod and Cielo Marjorie Goño
